## General Information

### ***First Aid***

First Aid will be available at Camp Headquarters. However, each Unit should be able to take care of minor Injuries. Injuries requiring medical attention should be reported to and attended by the staff at Headquarters.

Please have proper medical forms for each person. We will have trained medical personnel on staff for this Camporee.

***Documents:*** Please make sure each Scout has a signed Short Term Health Form, BSA Camping Waiver & Trollhaugen Waiver form.

## **Uniforms**

Scouts should be in Class "A" uniforms upon arrival, at Worship Services, at Flag Ceremonies, and during the Campfire Program. During the day on Saturday Scouts may dress in either Class "B" uniforms, Troop t-shirts, or appropriate attire.

## **Cost:**

**!!! LEADERS:** The **base cost** for the Expo this year is \$12.00 per person. This includes your patch, camp fees, lunch.

## **LIMITED TO FIRST 150 REGISTERED PARTICIPANTS, Scouts and Adult Leaders.**

**Conduct:** All scouts will be polite and courteous at all times. **Be Safe** at all times. Improper behaviors/actions are unacceptable.

**Cooking/Cleanup:** It is expected that scouts are in charge of cooking/clean-up in campsites, not the adults. All cooking and eating will be done in campsites.

**FIREWOOD:** To help comply with state wood transportation restrictions, District will provide firewood for all units.

**Events:** All events are designed for the youth (registered scouts/crew members) to successfully compete as a patrol.

Leaders/Adults may be asked to volunteer to help run stations or act as passive spectators of the events and are not participants. All other leaders / adults will participate in the team building ropes activities.

Good sportsmanship is expected from all participants and spectators. Events are designed to test current youth skills and knowledge and foster friendly competition between units.

**Lights out:** Scouts are not allowed out of their site after lights out with the exception of to and from the latrine. PLEASE respect others during lights out. Scouters are asked to bring roaming Scouts to the headquarters after lights out.
